




COMBINED MAP OF RECOMMENDATIONS

3. Wayfinding Recommendations	
Improve Guidance to Parking Facilities (New Parking Signs)	
This recommendation adds and replaces existing parking directional signs with new signs containing larger text and simpler messaging	
Rename Parking Facilities (Parking Lot Identity Signs)	
Rename all parking lots with location specific names Update all signs accordingly (e.g., county info (websites, etc.) and publicly accessible maps, e.g. Google)	
Add Advanced Parking Lot Full Status Signage	
Add three electronic signs on major thoroughfares entering Ellicott City before parking lots, indicating "OPEN/FULL" status of the primary lots down the road from the sign	
Add Pedestrian Directory Signage at Parking Facilities	

Adds new ground mounted directory signs at the walking path from the lot to the street. Sign to include map, events board, and optional insert for business listing
